Developmental Psychology (PSYC 40433)

Developmental Psychology is a course designed for seniors who have taken *Child Psychology* (PSYC 30323) and *Behavioral Research* (PSYC 30503). *Developmental Psychology* is run as a seminar, and has been approved as a CORE/UCR Writing Emphasis course. The course is challenging, and requires a mature attitude towards one's studies. Students will be required to write *weekly* papers (250–500 words) on assigned topics, be *active* participants in daily class discussion (based on assigned readings), and give 3–5 brief presentations on research articles.

An application is required for two reasons. First, demand for the course exceeds the number of available spots, so we want to make sure that those students who most need the class have a fair shot at enrolling. Second, many students end up in the course who do not have the background to do well, so we want to make sure that only those students who are well prepared are able to enroll.

In order to obtain a permit, you will need to answer the following questions, and then submit this form along with a *my.tcu.edu* printout of your previous coursework. Give both forms to Tami Joyce in the Psychology Department office, and we will notify you as soon as possible about your status (permit, waiting list). Priority will be given to those students whose need is greatest, and whose preparation is soundest.
